Provisions on the Scope of Registered Products

1. Purpose

The purpose of these provisions is to clarify the scope of antibacterial, antifungal, and antiviral products, as well as industrial sterilization coating materials (hereinafter referred to as "products") that are voluntarily registered with the SIAA.

2. Fundamental policies

- (1) In principle, nonporous products fall within the scope.
- (2) Pharmaceuticals, cosmetics, and other products where safety during use is not taken into consideration under the SIAA safety standards do not fall within the scope.
- (3) Products for which evaluation methods for textile products (e.g., JIS L 1902, JIS L 1922, and JIS L 1921) are appropriate do not fall within the scope.
- (4) Products for which test methods JIS Z 2801 or ISO 21702 are more appropriate fall within the scope, even though they are textile and similar products.
- (5) Products where registration is applied based on the evaluation results in accordance with the test method for photocatalysts (e.g., JIS R 1702) do not fall within the scope. However, those that satisfied the criteria in the test method JIS Z 2801 can be registered.

3. Examples of products that do and do not fall within the scope

^{*2)} Only products for post-treatment, such as industrial coating solutions and paints, fall within the scope of SIAA-registered products (industrial sterilization coating materials), and products for general consumers do not fall within the scope. In addition, coated materials (coated products) are outside the scope of registration, even if they are coated by professionals (Relevant SIAA brand marks cannot be born). If it is requested that a SIAA brand mark be born on coated materials, an antibacterial SIAA brand mark based on the result of a test conducted based on JIS Z 2801 shall be born.
